



WHAT IS HATE CRIME?

The Law says what people can and cannot do. When people break the Law, it may be a crime.

Any crime can be a Hate Crime



Hate Crime is when people are victims of a crime because of who they are.



Hate Crime is a crime against someone, or a group of people because

- of their **race**
- of their **religious belief** or because they **don't have a religious belief**
- they have a **disability**
- they are **gay, lesbian** or **bisexual**
- they are **transgender**



Some examples of Hate Crime are:

- someone saying hurtful things to you
- being hit, pushed or hurt
- stealing from you
- threats to your family



Hate Crime can start off small and then get worse and worse. For example, someone walking home gets called names. The next day they get things thrown at them. The day after they get hit. This is called **escalation**.

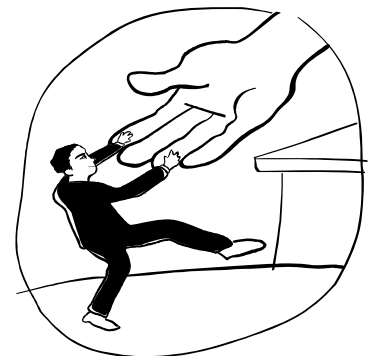


WHAT WE WANT TO DO ABOUT HATE CRIME

We want to help everyone to trust that the Law will protect them.



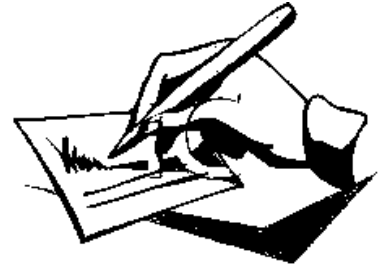
We want to stop Hate Crimes from happening, or getting more serious.

We will carry on listening to community groups and victims, to find out more about how Hate Crime affects people.



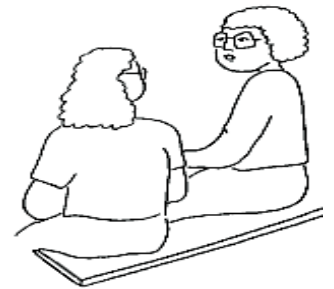
We will use what people tell us, to make sure that we have policies that really make a difference.

HATE CRIME REPORTING CENTRES

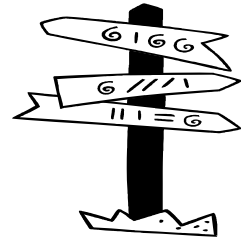
You can report a Hate Crime at any of St Leger Homes offices and lots of other places too.
